IRAT Officiates Sekolah Angkat MADANI, Marking Completion of LTAT & its Group of Companies' RM1.3 Million Programme Across 38 MAF Camp Schools

TANJUNG PENGELEH, JOHOR, 6 FEBRUARY 2026: The Armed Forces Fund Board ("LTAT"), together with its group of companies, today marked the successful completion of its Sekolah Angkat MADANI programme, delivering RM1.3 million in contributions to 38 schools located within Malaysian Armed Forces ("MAF") camps nationwide.

The programme's completion was commemorated at Sekolah Kebangsaan Tanjung Pengelih ("SKTP") and Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan Tanjung Pengelih ("SMKTP") and officiated by LTAT's Chief Executive, Mohammad Ashraf Md Radzi, alongside LTAT and IRAT's leadership team. The milestone reflects the culmination of a nationwide initiative that has directly benefited more than 24,000 students, the majority of whom are children of MAF personnel.

At Tanjung Pengelih, the programme, coordinated by IRAT Hotels & Resorts Sdn Bhd ("IRAT"), a subsidiary of LTAT, focused on Smart Classroom enhancements at both schools. These upgrades included improvements to learning infrastructure, digital teaching tools, classroom ergonomics and student-centred facilities. The delegation also visited a Pendidikan Khas Integrasi ("PPKI") classroom at SMKTP, where Mohammad Ashraf Md Radzi, on behalf of IRAT, presented a mock cheque symbolising the contribution of four additional air-conditioning units, building upon earlier infrastructure upgrades to create a more supportive learning environment for students with special educational needs.

Approximately RM100,000 was invested in the Tanjung Pengelih schools alone, covering classroom refurbishment, digital equipment, learning facilities, programme implementation and engagement activities. The visit also underscored the strength of collaboration within the MAF community, with support from Kem KD Sultan Ismail and sponsorship by IRAT.

The program was also attended by Captain Hazlan Hazumi RMN, Commanding Officer of KD Sultan Ismail Camp, as well as representatives from the Pejabat Pendidikan Daerah ("PPD") Kota Tinggi, underscoring the close collaboration between LTAT, the MAF and the national education ecosystem.

LTAT's Chief Executive, Mohammad Ashraf Md Radzi, commented on the achievement, "The completion of Sekolah Angkat MADANI across 38 schools is not simply the end of a programme, it is a statement of belief. A belief that every child of our servicemen and women deserves an environment that inspires learning, confidence and ambition."

"When we invest in education, we invest in futures. This initiative is about building strong foundations of character, opportunity and hope, so that the children of those who protect our nation can dream bigger and go further. Together, we are shaping schools that are not only better equipped, but ready for tomorrow." He added.

Across Malaysia, LTAT and its group of companies' Sekolah Angkat MADANI programme adopted a holistic approach encompassing infrastructure and classroom upgrades, digital and IT enhancements, inclusive learning support, mental well-being considerations and community-based engagement. The initiative was designed to ensure that schools within military camps remain conducive, resilient and future-ready, in line with the evolving needs of both students and educators.

With the completion of this phase, LTAT reaffirms its enduring commitment to safeguarding not only the socioeconomic future of MAF contributors but also the educational and social well-being of their families, fully aligned with the national aspirations of the MADANI framework.

The Sekolah Angkat MADANI initiative was launched by YAB Dato' Seri Anwar Ibrahim, Prime Minister of Malaysia, on 20 June 2025, as a national effort to strengthen education, social well-being and community resilience. LTAT's participation, implemented in collaboration with 14 group companies, reflects a unified, ecosystem-wide commitment to uplifting schools within military environments through meaningful, sustainable and high-impact interventions.
